

WALKING TOUR OF RADICAL PORTLAND

INSTRUCTIONS

Let's explore Portland! Portland has an amazing history of radical organizing. This map will show us where radical events have taken place throughout history and today.

What you need (included in your kit):

- Map of Portland
- Clues
- Blank stickers
- Tiny magnifying glass

What to do:

1. Check out your map! You'll notice some X's marking the spot ... but what are they marking?
2. Look at your clues! Each clue describes a different place in Portland where something important in Portland radical history took place. It also has the address. Match the address on the clue to the X's on the map to find out where these events happened! You might need to use the bonus maps and that tiny magnifying glass to read the map ...
3. Mark the spot! When you match a clue to an X on the map, write the name of the clue on a blank sticker and put it on the map over the X. When you are done, your whole map will be filled out with stickers that tell you the history of Portland's radical past and present!

BONUS: Walking tour!

If you have a way to go to these places in person, it can be really fun to see Portland radical history before your very eyes. We have organized the spots on your map into two walking tours that you can do with your friends and family. See the last pages for the two routes. P.S. They are kind of long for walking, so you might want to use a car or bus.

DOWNTOWN TOUR

1. IWW Hangout Spot (221 W Burnside)
2. Portland Hotel (700 SW 6th Ave (Currently Pioneer Courthouse))
3. Plaza Blocks (Between SW Salmon St, SW 4th Ave, SW Madison St, and SW 3rd Ave)
4. Park Blocks (1436 SW Park Ave)
5. Occupy ICE (4310 S Macadam Ave)
